Flexi-Paced Courses

Students begin on a set start date (**Jan 30, Mar 31, May 29, Jul 31, Sep 30, or Nov 30**) and work with their instructors to develop a flexible schedule to complete the course within the following nine months. *Mastering the Fundamentals of Music*, *The Process of Writing*, and *Crafting the Essay* are offered as flexi-paced courses. Allow at least two weeks for application processing.

Individually Paced Courses

Math (including AP Calculus), computer science, and science courses below the AP level are individually paced. Students may enroll at any time of year and proceed at their own pace within their enrollment period. Allow at least two weeks for application processing.
